2019 SIDEWALK PROJECT TO BEGIN JUNE 3RD

Currently the Hiram Street Department is marking utility locations in preparation for a \$300,000 sidewalk project. **The Village Sidewalk Project is scheduled to begin construction on Monday, June 3rd.** ALBA Contractors, Inc. will begin staging their equipment at Reign Hadsell Hiram School Park on Bancroft Street the week of May 27th.

This project is being paid for by the .25% income tax increase for street/sidewalk infrastructure improvements approved by Village residents in 2018.

Please be prepared for possible traffic delays.

SCHEDULE FOR 2019 BRUSH PICK-UP

 **Brush pick-up for 2019 will be the last Friday of May, June, July, August and September.** The amount of brush should be no more than two men can load in 15 minutes. Tree branches and brush should be no longer than 8 foot. Leaves and small twigs must be bagged in bio-degradable bags, and sealed with a bio-degradable tape or twine. Please, place your brush and leaf bags far enough from the curb to avoid road traffic.
