PLANNING & ZONING COMMISSION

LEAF PICK-UP FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 18TH



Hiram Village has contracted with an outside vendor to collect leaves on Friday, November 18th.

Please have leaves raked to the curb no later than Thursday, November 17th. Pick-up will occur on November 18th. The contractor will pass down each street one time only. *There will be no additional dates scheduled.*

Leaves should be raked to the curb, please do not rake into the street. This pick-up service is for leaves only. Please do not mix with twigs, branches, shrubs or other plant materials. *Bagged leaves will not be accepted.*

WINTER SIDEWALK CLEARING

From the Village Administrator – **Please be advised that per Village of Hiram Codified Ordinance 901.01 winter sidewalk cleaning and salting is the responsibility of the property owner.** The Street Department's primary concern is the plowing and salting of the Village streets. Although the Street Department has in the past cleared residential sidewalks, it is not the Department's first priority or responsibility. Thank you.

FROM THE HIRAM FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Hiram Fire Department wants to wish you and your family a Safe and Happy Holiday Season, and offers the following suggestions to keep your holiday safe:

*When purchasing a live tree look for signs of freshness. A fresh tree is green. Needles will be hard to pull from branches when bent between your fingers. Fresh needles don't break if bounced on the ground, and a minimum number of needles should fall off. *To keep your tree fresh, cut off about two inches of the trunk to expose fresh wood for better absorption of water, keep stored outside the house till you're ready to decorate and keep the stand filled with water.



* When placing your tree, make sure it is kept away from sources of heat, like fire places or heat vents, and out of the way of traffic, * Check out your lights before placing them on the tree. Look for worn or frayed wires and broken bulbs. Make sure you do not overload extension cords. * Take care when using candles. Keep them away from flammable decorations. Place them where they cannot be knocked over or reached by children. Do not leave lit candles in an unattended room. * Make sure your smoke detectors are working properly. If you'll be traveling to visit family and not sure if they have smoke detectors, take one with you.
