

ORDINANCE 2015-28

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE PERMANENT APPROPRIATIONS IN THE EMS SPECIAL REVENUE FUND (2901) BY \$70,000 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the voters of the Village of Hiram passed a levy to support additional Emergency Medical Service staffing in the Fire Department in November 2014; and

WHEREAS, as the result of the voters in Hiram Township passing a levy for additional Emergency Medical Services in November 2014, the Hiram Township Trustees have requested a higher level of Emergency Medical Services in Hiram Township; and

WHEREAS, the Hiram Village Fire Department is in the position to add staffing to increase the level of Emergency Medical Service in both Hiram Village and Hiram Township; and

WHEREAS, to fund the additional staffing, appropriations will need to be amended in the EMS Special Revenue Fund for EMS Payroll and Other Operations.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village Of Hiram, Portage County, Ohio with two-thirds of the members thereto concurring that:

Section 1: The current appropriations in the EMS Special Revenue Fund (2901-290) are \$185,055 with \$152,830 in Personal Services and \$32,225 in Other Operations. The new distribution needs to be \$217,830 in Personal Services and \$37,225 in Other Operations. The new total appropriations of the EMS Special Revenue Fund will be \$255,055.

Section 3: The prior and resulting amounts in the accounts after the change in appropriations are as follows:

EMS Personal Services:	\$152,830	\$217,830
Other Operations	<u>\$ 32,225</u>	<u>\$ 37,225</u>
TOTAL	\$185,055	\$255,055


Section 4: This Ordinance is declared an emergency measure becoming effective immediately upon its passage by Council and approval by the Mayor because the Fire Department needs the additional funding to cover the increase in 24/7 staffing.

Section 5: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council and any committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all legal requirements including §121.22 of the Revised Code of the State of Ohio.


